

2011-2012 ACPS Summer School Programs

Amherst County High School

Summer courses will be offered for students who are repeating a course in which they did not receive a passing grade the previous school year. Remedial summer school begins June 11 – July 12, 2012 (8:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.), 4 days per week (Monday – Thursday) for repeat courses. Schools will be closed on July 4-5 for the July 4 holiday. **Students are encouraged to register with their counselors before the regular school year is over.**

Elementary and Middle School

Remedial summer school is designed to provide additional instruction and learning strategies to students who have failed previously administered Standards of Learning (SOL) tests, or have been identified by classroom teachers as needing additional reinforcement in specific SOL content areas. All elementary and middle schools will offer a 4 day per week (Monday – Thursday) summer school from June 11 – June 28, 2012 (8:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.). **Students who fail all core-content area SOL tests will be required to participate in a summer remedial program.** You will be notified by the school as soon as SOL test results are received if your child is required to attend summer school.

New for this year: Eighth graders who are invited to attend remedial summer school will attend a “transitional” remedial summer school at the high school. In addition to their remedial instruction, they will be provided information about high school programs and expectations. More information will be forthcoming from the current school.

Fifth graders who are invited to attend remedial summer school will attend a “transitional” remedial summer school at the middle school they would typically attend. (Because Monelison Middle School will be undergoing upgrades to the electrical system, summer school will be held at Amherst Educational Center.) In addition to the remedial instruction, students will be provided information about middle school programs and expectations. More information will be forthcoming from the current school.
