Mr. Henderson called the meeting to order, asked that a moment of silence be observed and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Henderson asked if there were any changes to the agenda for the October 18, 2017, School Board Retreat.

Mr. Henderson asked if there was a motion to approve the agenda for the October 18, 2017, School Board Retreat.
