A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

AS JANUARY HAS COME TO A CLOSE, WE ARE MORE THAN HALF WAY THROUGH THE 2022-23 SCHOOL YEAR. ALTHOUGH THE YEAR IS HALFWAY OVER, I CONTINUE TO ENCOURAGE OUR FAMILIES TO REACH OUT TO YOUR STUDENT'S SCHOOL IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, CONCERNS OR IF WE MAY BE OF ASSISTANCE. PLEASE CONTINUE TO SPEAK WITH YOUR STUDENTS ABOUT THEIR NEED TO ATTEND SCHOOL, DO THEIR BEST ON THEIR SCHOOL WORK, AND EXHIBIT POSITIVE BEHAVIOR.

THE PAST MONTH HAS BEEN DIFFICULT FOR THE ACPS FAMILY AS WE HAVE DEALT WITH THE PASSING OF THREE OF OUR STUDENTS. WE WERE NOTIFIED IN LATE DECEMBER OF AN INCIDENT INVOLVING ONE OF OUR FOSTER PARENTS AND FOUR PASSENGERS ON THE ROCKFISH RIVER. WE HAD INFORMATION THAT THREE OF THE PASSENGERS WERE OUR STUDENTS. IN JANUARY, TWO OF THE PASSENGERS WERE IDENTIFIED AS CHRISTOPHER DOSS (IITH GRADE ACHS) AND JASIAH DAVIS (6TH GRADE AMS). TODAY WE WERE NOTIFIED THAT THE BODY RECOVERED ON JANUARY 27, 2023 WAS MYSON SYLVESTRE (I2TH GRADE ACHS). THOUGH WE ARE SADDENED BY THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, WE ARE THANKFUL THAT WE CAN BEGIN TO BRING CLOSURE TO THIS INCIDENT FOR OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY. PLEASE KEEP THE FAMILIES OF CHRISTOPHER, JASIAH, AND MYSON AS WELL AS OUR STUDENTS AND STAFF IN YOUR THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS AS WE CONTINUE TO DEAL WITH THIS TRAGIC SITUATION.

MOTHER NATURE HAS BEEN PROVIDING US WITH PLENTY OF MOISTURE BUT THE COLD TEMPERATURES HAVE NOT BEEN AROUND TO GIVE US MUCH IN THE WAY OF WINTER PRECIPITATION. WE HAVE HAD A FEW MARGINAL MORNINGS WHERE THE TEMPERATURES HAVE BEEN AROUND FREEZING THAT HAS CAUSED US CONCERN. JUST SO YOU ARE AWARE, WE DO OUR BEST TO COMMUNICATE WITH VDOT, THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE, AND THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE IN ADDITION TO CONSULTING WITH OUR INTERNAL TEAM WHEN MAKING DECISIONS REGARDING DELAYS OR CLOSURES. THE PROBLEM WE HAVE FACED THIS YEAR IS THE MAJORITY OF OUR WEATHER SYSTEMS HAVE BEEN HITTING AROUND THE 5:00 – 7:00 AM TIME FRAME WHICH PUTS US IN DIFFICULT SITUATION WHEN WE DETERMINE IF WE CAN OPERATE ON A REGULAR SCHEDULE. DUE TO OUR BUS SCHEDULE WE NEED TO MAKE A DECISION BY 5:40 AM. AS A RESULT, WE HAVE TO MAKE DECISIONS BASED ON THE INFORMATION WE HAVE AT THE TIME. PLEASE KNOW THAT WE HAVE THE SAFETY OF OUR STAFF AND STUDENTS AS THE FOCUS OF EVERY WEATHER RELATED DECISION THAT WE MAKE.

THERE IS A POSSIBILITY THAT WE WILL OPERATE REMOTELY WHEN WE NEED TO "CLOSE" DUE TO THE WEATHER. WE WILL DO OUR BEST TO NOTIFY OUR PARENTS AND STUDENTS OF THE POSSIBILITY OF A REMOTE DAY IN ADVANCE. WHEN WE OPERATE REMOTELY, WE ARE STILL REQUIRED TO OFFER MEALS TO OUR STUDENTS. IF WE OPERATE REMOTELY, WE WILL OPERATE THE KITCHENS AT AMHERST COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL AND MONELISON MIDDLE SCHOOL AS FEEDING LOCATIONS. SINCE WE NEED TO BE ABLE TO FEED STUDENTS, WE CAN ONLY OPERATE REMOTELY IF ROAD CONDITIONS ARE SAFE ENOUGH FOR THE CAFETERIA STAFF TO REPORT AND PARENTS CAN ACCESS THE BUILDINGS. WE HAVE INCLUDED ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON REMOTE INSTRUCTIONAL DAYS IN THE NEWSLETTER.

THE "COMMUNITY DINNER" WAS A GREAT SUCCESS AS WE HAD 177 COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND FAMILIES PARTICIPATE IN THE EVENT. I WOULD LIKE TO OFFER A BIG "THANK YOU" TO EVERYONE WHO WAS IN ATTENDANCE AND I HOPE YOU FOUND THE EVENING TO HAVE BEEN BENEFICIAL. I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO THANK OUR SHOW UP AMHERST TEAM, IRON LIVES, AND THE AMHERST COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS EDUCATION FOUNDATION FOR ALL THEY DID IN THE PLANNING AND EXECUTION OF THE EVENT. ADDITIONALLY, THIS EVENING COULD NOT HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE WITH THE GENEROUS FINANCIAL SUPPORT OF GLAD/CLOROX FOR THE EDUCATION FOUNDATION AND THE SHOW UP AMHERST INITIATIVE. I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO THANK SHIMILA KEENUM FOR THE INFORMATIVE PRESENTATION SHE PROVIDED AT THE DINNER.

SPEAKING OF SHOW UP AMHERST, WE HAVE OUR NEXT DIVISION WIDE SHOW UP DAY SCHEDULED FOR MARCH 17. WE HAVE ASKED SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS TO WORK WITH THEIR FACULTY, STAFF, AND STUDENTS FOR FEEDBACK AND SUPPORT WHEN PLANNING THIS EVENT. PLEASE REACH OUT TO YOUR SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO VOLUNTEER OR SUPPORT THE SCHOOL FOR THIS OR OTHER EVENTS. OUR GOAL IS TO CONTINUE TO BUILD POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH OUR STUDENTS AND ENCOURAGE THEM TO ATTEND SCHOOL. IT IS DIFFICULT FOR STUDENTS TO GET THE FULL BENEFIT OF THEIR EDUCATION IF THEY ARE NOT IN SCHOOL.

I THANK YOU AGAIN FOR ALL YOU DO FOR ACPS. IT IS IMPORTANT FOR US TO REMEMBER THAT WE ARE ALL ON THE SAME TEAM WITH THE SAME OBJECTIVE WHICH IS TO PROVIDE THE BEST EDUCATION POSSIBLE FOR OUR STUDENTS. I TRULY BELIEVE THAT WE CAN ACCOMPLISH THIS IF WE ALL WORK TOGETHER TOWARD THAT GOAL. ALTHOUGH WE MAY HAVE SOME DIFFERENCES OF OPINION AND MAY DISAGREE AT TIMES WE WILL ACCOMPLISH SO MUCH MORE FOR OUR STUDENTS AND COMMUNITY IF WE WORK TOGETHER. Remote Learning Day Information

As we are in the midst of winter months and weather is always problematic we would like to remind you that it is our intention to provide instructional opportunities to all students even in the event that they are not required to report to school. ACPS will, if deemed appropriate, call for a Remote Learning Day due to weather instead of Closing schools. This means that all students would be required to participate in instruction while at home.





If a Remote Learning Day is called, your students' School Principal will send out a school messenger providing you with instructions for your students participation requirements for the day. This can either be completing work on their Canvas or Google Classrooms using their school-provided Chromebook, or logging into a virtual classroom using a Google Meet link assigned by their teacher. Please ensure that your student brings home their Chromebook each day in order to be prepared for any Remote Learning Days.

The division will be providing bag lunches at designated north end and south end locations of the county. That information will also be sent out by a school messenger so that you may access that for your students. 

Communication

USING POSITIVE DISCIPLINE

Children do well when they feel respected and listened to, much of this begins with good communication skills modeled by you.



CONNECTION

Is this interaction/communication helping the child feel a sense of connection? Is it meeting their need for belonging and significance?

MUTUALLY RESPECTFUL

Is this interaction/communication both kind AND Firm? Respect for yourself and the situation (Firmness) Respect for the needs of the child and others (Kindness)



EFFECTIVE LONG TERM

What characteristics and life skills do you want this child to have as they reach adulthood?



ENCOURAGEMENT

Mistakes are opportunities to learn. Respond to mistakes with compassion and kindness instead of shame, blame and lectures. When appropriate, use curiosity questions to help the child explore the consequences of the choices made.


