We experienced a very mild winter and only missed two days of school due to inclement weather. When we develop our school calendar, we build in time to account for inclement weather. The Amherst County School Board will consider additional calendar adjustments at the April 6 school board meeting.

# 2023-2024 SCHOOL OPERATIONAL BUDGET

The school board approved the recommended budget as presented at the School Board retreat to include a minimum of a 7% pay increase for all employees, an additional 1% increase for transportation, moving custodians to the grounds pay table, resulting in an additional 1-3% average increase, and a total 15% increase for child nutrition staff.

Dr. Wells presented the budget to the Amherst County Board of Supervisors on March 21. The Board of Supervisors will now hold a public hearing on the County Budget in April and approval of the budget will be on the agenda for their first meeting in May.

The main thing to consider with our budget is the state has not approved a budget as of yet. We built our budget off of the Governor's proposed budget and anticipate funding to be at that level or higher.

However, we will not have any final numbers until the General Assembly passes and the Governor signs the state budget.


