AMHERST COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS-FEBRUARY 28, 2023

We have completed another month of school as February is coming to close. We have three more months of school left before the end of the year. Although the end is getting near, we have a tremendous amount of work left to do. Let us all remain focused on our students and continue to provide them with the best education possible as we move into the waning stages of the year.

The past couple of months have been difficult for us as we have dealt with the deaths of students and a staff member. The incident on the Rockfish River in December resulted in the loss of three of our students: Myson Sylvester, 12 grade ACHS, Christopher Doss, 11th grade ACHS, and Jasiah Davis, 6th grade AMS. The body of another 12 year old juvenile who did not attend ACPS was recovered last week. We were also notified that a former student who attended CES and AMS before transferring to Lynchburg was a victim of a gunshot wound in Lynchburg last Friday and succumbed to her injuries while at the hospital. Finally, we had the passing of Mr. Keith Coley, an employee in our maintenance department. Keith passed away unexpectedly on February 19, 2023. Please keep the families, friends, and the staff members who worked with the students and Keith in your thoughts and prayers as we continue to work through their loss.

We have proposed a budget to the ACPS School Board that calls for a 7% pay increase for all staff and substitutes. We also proposed an 8% increase for our employees of the transportation department, moving the custodial pay scale to the same as grounds which will result in an 8%-10% increase for custodians, and a 15% increase for food service. It is important to note that every 1% increase in salaries requires us to allocate \$390,000 in local funds. Although the state is proposing a 7% pay increase for educators they only fund the Standards of Quality (SOQ) funded positions. We have approximately 400 SOQ funded staff and 350 staff who are funded through local dollars. As a result of the state funding formula, I have had to build a budget that requires me to ask the Board of Supervisors for an additional \$2.5 million in local funding. Although we believe we are in a good place with our budget we still need the budget to be approved by the School Board and the Board of Supervisors before it will be finalized. We have a budget retreat scheduled for the Thursday, March 2, 2023 to work through the budget with the School Board and I am scheduled to present our budget to the Board of Supervisors on March 21. I will update you on the budget process as it moves forward. There is more information on the budget, to include my presentation to the board, in the newsletter.

The winter weather continues to evade us this year. We have had conditions that are more in line with spring than winter and I hope you have been able to enjoy the warm weather. We still have the opportunity for winter weather through mid-March so don't give up hope yet but the opportunities are going to diminish the closer we get to April. Now that we are closer to spring we have to be on the lookout for severe weather as well. We will be in contact with staff regarding plans to close or operate remotely if a weather event is forecast for our area that would impact our ability to operate schools safely.

We held our recruiting fair last weekend and had a very good turnout. We interviewed several prospective employees that we hope will join Team Amherst for the 2023–2024 school year. I would like thank everyone who was a part of the recruiting fair, I especially want to recognize Madison Massie, Wendy Sale, and Jim Gallagher for their work in the planning and execution of the event.

In closing, I want to thank each of you for all you do for our students on daily basis. I encourage to continue to keep the students the focus of your decisions. Please continue to support each other at work and in life. If we continue to work together we can overcome any obstacle that is in our path.



MORDS OF AFFIRMANION

As humans we have a basic need for love and belonging. One of the best ways we can meet this need in our children is to model using words of affirmation and help them develop positive self-talk.



Say something like one of these phrases to your child:
"You are... loved.
powerful.
blessed."



"I can do hard things."

"I am strong and brave."

Try a call and response (you say the words and have your child repeat them to you.) "I am enough" "I am lovable" "I am smart" "I am capable"

"It's okay to make mistakes."

"It's okay to ask for help." "I can make good choices."

"I am important."

"I believe in myself and my abilities."

> "Today is going to be an awesome day."

Often we (and our children) say things to ourselves that are negative or hurtful. We can work to change this pattern through awareness and modeling for our children how to encourage ourselves with our words.
